Prescribed Trail IT'S THE LAW!

It is the law in Ontario for recreational sleds* using OFSC Prescribed Snowmobile Trails to have and display a valid Snowmobile Trail Permit. Fines for failure to comply range from a minimum of \$200 to a maximum of \$1000. *exemptions or partial exemptions for specific user groups.
